The Storytime page has free online books and videos, games, prizes, book-themed quizzes and tutorials on how to draw some of your favourite characters.

There is also a handy 'Bookfinder' tool.



This site has lots of reading books and resources. There is a free eBook library, you just need to register. There are also lots of storyteller videos for children of all Primary School ages.

Please note, the eBooks are not optimised for mobile phones and are best viewed on a computer, laptop, or tablet.



Whilst schools are closed, children can stream a huge collection of stories, including titles across eight different languages, that will help them continue dreaming, learning, and just being kids. All stories are free to stream on your desktop, laptop, phone or tablet.



Storyline Online is an interactive children's literacy site that features famous actors reading children's books alongside minor animation elements. Each video gives details of the run time, book author, illustrator, and publisher, suggested grade level (U.S.), and a plot summary.



Leicestershire Libraries are still enabling us to borrow books through their eLibrary service. You can borrow ebooks and eAudiobooks from Borrowbox with your regular library card.
