#### Children's Mental Health Week 2021 - Express Yourself

#### Kick Start Grant

British Science Week takes place every year in March, but is going to look a little different this year!

In previous years we have been lucky enough to be offered grants for visits from the National Space Centre with their StarDome and to take the students to Twycross Zoo. This year we have once more been offered funding to enable our students to experience science in a different way to their normal science lessons. This time we have received a British Science Week Kick Start Grant which we have used to purchase a rocket car launcher and rocket car kits. We plan to use this equipment to allow our students to explore forces, aerodynamics and engineering, and as we have been able to purchase the equipment ourselves many more students will be able to benefit over the coming years and across our various school sites.

The school has registered to take part in The Royal Academy Young Artists Summer Show. The Young Artists' Summer Show is a free, open submission exhibition for students aged 5 - 19 studying in the UK and British schools overseas. Artworks are judged by artists and arts professionals with selected artworks displayed online and on-site at the Royal Academy of Arts. There is a permission slip available for parents/guardians to complete on behalf of the students, these are available from the school office or directly from the website, see below.

Each student can submit up to three artworks of any type and there is no theme. When you enter images of the students artwork plus some information about the piece such as title, size, and a little text about the artwork and why they made it will be needed. The students artwork will be submitted and then seen by a panel of judges and the selected pieces will be shown in the RA online exhibition. Some of the artworks will also be shown at the Royal Academy of Arts. In addition prizes are awarded to two artists from each key stage, as chosen by the President of the Royal Academy. There is also an opportunity for you to vote for your favourite in the annual peoples choice Award.

This is an invitation for all bases to take part, so if any students wish to submit some work jpegs of students work are required before the 25th April 2021.

I look forward to seeing some wonderful art work made our young people.



#### FREE SCHOOL MEALS

Your children may be eligible for free school meals if you receive:

- income support
- income-based jobseekers allowance
- income-related employment and support allowance
- national asylum seeker support
- child tax credit (providing you're not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- the guaranteed element of state pension credit
- working tax credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for working tax credit

Applying could also help your school get extra funding through the Government's Pupil Premium scheme.
