During admission, KS3 and 4 students complete a baseline assessment (Unit 1). If their home school provide work they can follow Unit 2, if not they will follow appropriate units from Units 3 – 12

<p>Unit 1 – Baseline</p> <p>Information collected from own/previous school. Students complete:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Vernon Spelling Test • Single Word Reading • All About Me (Pre KS3) • KS2 Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling Paper(KS3) • Edexcel English Language Paper 1 Section A (KS4) 	<p>Unit 2 – Work Set By Own School</p> <p>Students complete tasks set by their own school.</p> <p>Physical resources may be provided by their own school or tasks can be emailed to staff. Alternatively, students can access a school VLE or intermediate online application, such as Edmodo, through which their school can set tasks.</p>	<p>Unit 3 – Spoken Language</p> <p>Students complete tasks on persuasion and the features of a speech, leading to writing their own speech and practising presenting this to an audience. Students will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • present information and ideas effectively • plan effectively for different audiences • use Standard English appropriately • present a speech confidently and respond to any questions/feedback 	<p>Unit 4 – Reading- Fiction</p> <p>Students read a variety of fiction extracts and complete tasks with a focus on exam skills needed for KS4 students. Students will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • show comprehension of stories and ideas • locate and retrieve information • identify and select relevant evidence. • evaluate a writer's choice of language and structure, explaining effect 	<p>Unit 5 – Reading- Non-fiction</p> <p>Students read a range of non-fiction extracts and complete tasks with a focus on exam skills needed for KS4 students. Students will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • comprehension of non-fiction texts • select and retrieve information • choose relevant quotations • explain how language choices effect a reader • comment on similarities and differences 	<p>Unit 6 – Creative Writing</p> <p>Students practise a range of skills to improve creative writing ability. Students will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • demonstrate an understanding of key writing techniques • use 'show don't tell' techniques • use paragraphs to structure a narrative effectively • plan and write an effective narrative using appropriate techniques to engage the reader
<p>Unit 7 – Transactional Writing</p> <p>Students to cover non-fiction, transactional writing skills. Students will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • show understanding of key features • adapt language and tone to suit audience and purpose • use paragraphs effectively, connecting ideas within and between paragraphs 	<p>Unit 8 – Poetry</p> <p>Students to study a range of poems with a focus on exam skills needed for KS4 students. Students will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • show an understanding of poetic terms and devices • use subject terminology • show an awareness of context • explain the tone and themes • analyse the effect of language and structural choices, using evidence appropriately 	<p>Unit 9 – Shakespeare</p> <p>An Introduction to Shakespeare with a focus on exam skills needed for KS4 students. Students will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • show an understanding of historical context • recognise that language evolves and engage with Elizabethan language • show an understanding of, and apply, Shakespearean vocabulary • apply the sonnet form to their own writing 	<p>Unit 10 – Literature Study</p> <p>Students study literature texts with a focus on set texts for KS4 students. Students will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • show an understanding of plot • analyse theme and character • show understanding of the social and historical context • use textual references, including quotations • analyse language, form and structure • use subject terminology 	<p>Unit 11 – The Art of Persuasion</p> <p>Students invent a new breakfast cereal and complete promotional tasks using persuasive techniques. Students will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • understand persuasive and AFOREST techniques • use imagination to create a relevant product • produce effective promotional material • demonstrate understanding of persuasive articles and discuss comparisons 	<p>Unit 12 – Punctuation</p> <p>Students revise the use of punctuation, completing activities which test knowledge. Students will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • use a range of punctuation including semi-colons accurately • use a colon to introduce a list and understand it's multiple uses • use commas in a list, for complex sentences and parenthesis • use quotation marks accurately
