## Dear Parents/Carers

As we approach the Easter break I want to pass on my thanks for the support you have given the school this last term. We are busier than we have ever been, with student numbers at an all-time high across each school base. Without the support of families, staff and other agencies we would not be able to provide the high level of care we aim for.

Despite the pressures, our staff continue to go above and beyond in providing such an enriching curriculum. In addition to the academic curriculum, there is a very comprehensive offer beyond that including arts, music, sport and Duke of Edinburgh to name but a few. Some staff even organised an evening visit to see An Inspector Calls at the theatre with students and families attending.

When our young people are ready to leave, the staff across all bases work closely with other provisions to ensure a smooth transition. It has been really great to see lots of students successfully return to their home school or onto a new placement. Our outreach work to support other organisations also continues to grow and we have now trained over 100 professionals in mental health support.

Our Year 11 students are getting closer to the exam period and staff have provided some detailed revision plans to support during this time. There is information on the website but please contact subject teachers if you'd like any specific information or advice. We know it can be an anxious time, but staff are working hard to help students be at their best.

After Easter we have a new teacher, Roxanne Steane joining the team based at the Leicester Royal Infirmary. We hope to have another teaching assistant joining the Magpie Learning Centre by May.

Like me, you've probably had enough of the wet weather and are looking forward to summer. I hope you all have a restful break and can enjoy the longer and (hopefully) warmer days. We return to school on Monday 17<sup>th</sup> April.



## LEICESTER READATHON



#### **SPRING GOVERNOR NEWS**

Welcome to our Spring Term update of news from the Children's Hospital School Governing Body, the purpose of which is to keep parents informed of some of the activities of the school governing body.

Governors have continued to visit the school over the course of the Spring Term.

A 'Getting to Know' visit took place at The Beacon as well as a number of monitoring visits across the school bases:

- Intervention and Transition at the Magpie Learning Centre
- Reading
- Health & Safety
- Safeguarding
- Teaching and Learning at the LRI

Visits provide the opportunity to monitor key areas of the school, meet staff and students and bring into context information and reports shared at meetings.

#### **Meet the Governor**

Nikki is currently the Staff Governor and a member of the Curriculum and Standards Committee. She joined the Governing Body in September 2021.

Nikki teaches Health and Social Care and RSE. She is also currently completing a Post Graduate Certificate in Understanding Domestic and Sexual Violence at The University of Worcester.

Before joining The Children's Hospital School, Nikki was involved in youth work, leading North Warwickshire Young Carers.

Nikki is the link Governor for SEND and Creativity.

## **Monitoring**

Some of the key areas looked at this term included:

- Individual Health Care Plans the way in which they are used in the school to support the needs of students, and how the school supports other stakeholders with this.
- Presentation from Paul Gibson, Leader Teacher of English, on the outcomes and impact of the English peer review which took place in October.
- Film Studies presentation from Steve Pepper (Film/Drama teacher) focusing on the GCSE curriculum, teaching and learning and assessment.
- Presentation from Nikki Cole (Head of Magpie Learning Centre) on the provision offered at the Magpie for early intervention placements including curriculum, student experience, transitions and progress made since it's opening in August 2022.
- The Headteacher's Report from the Spring term was discussed, including the PE and Sports Premium, updates from each Base, an overview of the outcomes from the work scrutiny which took place across the school in February and an update on referral data this academic year.
- An update on the School Improvement Plan, including the progress made towards the school's objectives.
- Management Accounts discussed and scrutinised by the Finance Committee, including approval of the Schools Financial Values Standard.



## **YEAR 11 REVISION @ WILLOW BANK**

There are now only 4 school weeks remaining until the beginning of the GCSE exams. Students should have received their **revision guide**, **revision planner and revision bag** (full of goodies to help with their revision!)

**Exam packs** have been sent home which contain a statement of entry and individual timetable. It is important to look through these and ensure all information is correct. A copy of the exam timetable can also be found in the revision guide and on the school website.

## **ONLINE SAFETY**

# Keep your child safe on TikTok



#### What is it?

A video-sharing app that's very popular with children and teenagers. You lip-sync to music or do comedy sketches, and can add effects to your videos. You can also gain followers ('fans') and watch other people's videos.

The age recommendation is **13 and above**, but it's easy for younger children to sign up too.

## What are the main things to watch out for?

- Sexual lyrics and swearing in songs
- Content about eating disorders (known as 'proana') and bullying
- 'Challenges' that users take part in that are potentially dangerous
- Emojis that are seen as sexually suggestive, like the aubergine

Under-16s can't send or receive private messages. But once users have made contact, like through comments on videos, they could still switch to another app like Snapchat to chat privately and swap images and videos.

#### 7 steps to keep your child safe

Full details can be found on our school webpage for Online Safety

- 1. Use family pairing (also known as family safety mode)
- Keep their account set to private and limit profile information
- 3. Set age limits so your child doesn't see inappropriate content
- 4. Consider setting a time limit on use
- 5. Restrict in-app purchases to block spending
- 6. Check settings on interactions like duets, direct messages and comments
- 7. Make sure your child knows how to report content and users

#### FREE ONLINE PARENTING COURSES

We are delighted to announce that a range of free online parenting courses are available for all residents of Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland from today.

The Solihull Approach courses cover concerns that parents often face with children, from before they are born to early adulthood, including physical and mental health, understanding their feelings and how to build better relationships.

The courses include the same content as you would receive in a typical face-to-face parenting group run by health visitors. They are available in 108 languages, with voiceovers in English and Urdu. Each course has a number of different components, and they can be accessed at any time and any place.

The courses include:

- Understanding pregnancy, labour, birth and your baby
- Understanding your baby
- Understanding your child 0-19 years
- Understanding your child with additional needs
- Understanding the impact of the pandemic on your teenager
- Understanding your teenager's brain
- Understanding your brain
- Understanding your child's feelings
- Understanding your child's mental health and wellbeing
- Understanding your relationships
- Further courses are currently in development, including a specific course for supporting children and young people with possible neurodevelopmental conditions.

All courses are free to access for anyone with an LLR postcode – it just requires users to create an account to access them – and they are available for the next two years. More details, including how to register and access the courses, are available

## **INFORMATION FOR PARENTS**

## **FREE SCHOOL MEALS**

Your children may be eligible for free school meals if you receive:

- > income support
- > income-based jobseekers allowance
- > income-related employment and support allowance
- > national asylum seeker support
- > child tax credit (providing you're not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- > the guaranteed element of state pension credit
- > working tax credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for working tax credit

Applying could also help your school get extra funding through the Government's Pupil Premium scheme.
