## The Beacon – Discover Arts Award

<b>Part A- Discover</b>	<b>Part B – Find Out</b>
<p><b>What Students should do.</b> Students should identify a minimum of two art forms to be able to see the breadth of the arts around them. To take part in at least one art activity to widen their experience and understanding of the arts. Through active participation, they develop their understanding of how the arts are all around us and how a range of art forms connect to their own lives.</p> <p><b>What the student should demonstrate through their evidence</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• An understanding of how the arts encompass a range of art forms from the familiar to the unfamiliar.</li><li>• Participation in art activities</li><li>• An understanding of how art forms connect to their own lives.</li></ul>	<p><b>What Students should do.</b> Students find out about at least one artist and their work to develop their understanding of arts practice. This could be through workshops, interviews, visits, attending events, watching events online and online research.</p> <p><b>What the student should demonstrate through their evidence</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Knowledge of at least one artist and their work</li><li>• A record of what they found out about at least one artist and their work.</li></ul>

<b>Part C- Share</b>
<p><b>What Students should do.</b> Young people share with others what they enjoyed and learnt through the award. It could be a one-to-one or group activity and can take any form, from explanation to performance. This can also be done via PowerPoint.</p> <p><b>What the student should demonstrate through their evidence.</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Knowledge of at least one artist and their work.</li><li>• A record of what they found out about at least one artist and their work.</li></ul>
